New Candidates must register with the Online Admission Portal at <https://gcbhamour.highthaleducation.in/>. All candidates must apply before Last Date. Before applying candidate must have following document/particulars handy:

1. An active E-Mail ID and a valid Mobile number.
2. E-mail ID and Mobile number must belong to the candidate himself/herself or someone in the family. DO NOT fill in friend's or Cyber CAFÉ's Email ID and Mobile number.
3. Email ID is necessary to activate candidate's registration. The system permits an email ID to be registered only once.
4. Aadhaar number.
5. Recent passport size photograph and signature.
6. Detailed Marks Card of previous passed examination.
7. Candidates wishing to apply for Reservation must have a valid supporting document.
8. Please keep your email ID and mobile number active, at least until the admission process is complete, as all communication will be sent through E-mail/SMS. It is advised to regularly check email, SMS and visit College website for latest updates over admission process.

Documents Required for Online Admission

1. Scanned/soft copies of all original Board certificates from matric onwards.
2. Recent soft copy of passport size photograph. Size of the photograph (passport size) should not exceed 50 KB. (Ht. X Wd. = 4.5 X 3.5 cm)
3. Scanned Signature.
4. Scanned copy of character certificate from the head of institution last attended (for candidates applying for admission in first year or migrating students). The original character certificate to be submitted in the college.
In case of student who has discontinued his/her studies for one or more year the character certificate must be supplemented by another character certificate obtained from Class I Gazetted Officer or the Panchayat Pradhan of the village/illaka concerned.

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Note: The character certificate must not have been issued more than six months prior to the date of admission.

5. Students with a gap of one year or more have to upload scanned copy of a declaration stating gap & reasons thereof.
6. Scanned/soft copies of SC/ST/OBC/EWS certificate for those seeking relaxation or weightage.
7. Scanned/soft copies of IRDP, NCC, NSS, Sports, Cultural Quota, physically handicapped certificates for those seeking relaxation or weightage.
8. The candidates from other Boards/University, must submit in the College:
 - a. Eligibility certificate from H.P. Board/University showing equivalence.
 - b. Migration Certificate.
9. All girl candidates have to upload scanned/soft copy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate for getting Exemption from Tuition fee.



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1. INTRODUCTION OF THE COLLEGE

Govt. College Bharmour was established in 2005 vide Government Notification No. EDN-A Kha (16) dated 03.08.2005. The College offers undergraduate programmes, namely Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Commerce, and is affiliated to Sardar Patel University, Mandi and serves as an examination center for the University.

The College is situated near the renowned Chaurasi (84) temple complex in Bharmour town – a historically significant and picturesque valley of Chamba District in Himachal Pradesh. Surrounded by a panorama of snow-capped mountains, and flanked by the Budhil River, Bharmour derives its name from the historic Brahmapur Kindgom, and served as its capital before the administration was shifted to Chamba.

The College is currently running in SADA & DAV Halls, and Govt. Boy's and Girl's Senior Secondary Schools in Bharmour. The College building is under construction near Helipad and most likely be ready in this academic session.

4. GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

4.1 GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

1. Admission will be made on the recommendation of the Admission Committee.
2. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
3. All admissions will be provisional subject to the approval of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla/ Sardar Patel University, Mandi.
4. All terms and conditions of admission and fee structure can be changed or modified as per the directions of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla/ Sardar Patel University, Mandi and the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh.
5. Applicant must upload scanned original certificates on admission portal.
6. Applicant having a gap of one or more years in their studies will have to accept an undertaking.
7. Every student seeking admission in any class will be required to pay Rs. 500/- per annum towards PTA fund. Fees and funds once deposited will not be refunded.
8. Girl students seeking admission in any class must upload scanned/soft copy of H.P. Bonafide certificate to avail concessional fees (Tuition Fee Only).
9. Students seeking exemption from Fee for disability must upload scanned/soft copy of 40% disability certificate.
10. The admission of a student who is seeking admission to Three Years Degree Course (TDC) II or TDC III on the basis of educational qualifications acquired from the University other than the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla/ Sardar Patel University, Mandi shall be regularized on the basis of equivalence of syllabi as and when decided by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla/ Sardar Patel University, Mandi.
11. Candidates coming from school of education Board/University other than HP Board of School Education/ Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla/ Sardar Patel University, Mandi must submit copy of migration certificate in the college.
12. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/ wrong/ false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such a candidate.
13. A student who has been expelled or rusticated shall not be admitted to any course of study without the prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
14. Students passed after re-valuation shall not be considered for admission/promotion to the higher class after the expiry of the scheduled date of admission as per the rule framed under Ordinance 6.70(e) H.P.U. vide letter No. 4-19 2003-H.P.U. (Acad) dated 24th January 2003.

4.2 ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. This year, the admission is through online mode. Interested candidate are advised to apply for admission through the admission portal available at: <https://gcbhamour.hightheducation.in/>.
2. In case a candidate is using the website/admission portal for first time and do not have a Login ID and password click on “Click here to register (new user)” to register on admission portal by filling his/her name, email ID, phone number and by creating & confirming a password. On clicking REGISTER button, candidate will receive an activation email.
3. Applicant(s) must verify the email before logging in. It is a onetime process. Verification mail may reflect in inbox or spam folder of the email account holder.
4. Candidate will be able to login to the admission portal by using these credentials in all future visits to the admission portal. The online application form is to be filled up by the applicant carefully after reading all rules, eligibility conditions.
5. After filling login-password, click on LOG-IN. He/she will be redirected to dashboard page, from where he/ she can apply for the relevant course.
6. Applicant(s) need to click on ‘Click Here to Apply’ link, to apply for the Course.
7. You will be on a screen to fill application form.

Various columns and dropdowns will appear on screen and candidate will have to fill or choose as applicable in his/her case and complete all the information and then click on SAVE AND NEXT. Candidate will also be required to upload his/her photograph, signature and documents. All data will be saved against candidate’s registered ID. Candidate will be able to view and can modify the information, if final form is not submitted.

8. Before final submission, candidates are advised to purview the form, and if it is complete, Click on SUBMIT AND PAY PROSPECTUS PAYMENT
On completion of application form, student will have option to make the payment of Rs 50/- online using debit card, credit card, net banking. A receipt will be generated after payment has been successfully made online.
9. After online submission of admission form, candidates have to appear before the Admission Committee along with all original documents on the specified date & time of counseling.
10. College authorities will scrutinize/verify the uploaded documents to confirm that there is no shortcoming or deficiency in the application form. On any deficiency, a SMS/email will be sent on candidate’s number/email ID.
11. On satisfaction of college authorities, admission will be granted subject to eligibility and availability of seats, a confirmation SMS/email will be sent on candidate’s number/email ID.
12. The candidate will be required to deposit the fee ONLINE. After deposition of fee, the candidate has to take the printout of application form for onward submission in the College along with photocopies of documents.

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13. In case the student fails to deposit his/her fee online before due date, the seat will be offered to the next eligible candidate.

14. Student will get information, like roll no., time-table etc. through SMS/email, and from College Notice Board.

4.3 ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

A pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English).

Bachelor of Arts (BA): At least 33% marks.

- The student who wishes to take Mathematics as Core/Minor subject must have read Mathematics at 10+2 level.

Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com): At least 40% marks (for girls 33%).

- The Minimum Eligibility for Non-Commerce Students shall be 45% marks in +2 examination (Only those students who have opted either Mathematics or Economics in +2).

Important:

- Applicant who has passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com Programme.
- Applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl applicant, 26 years for SC and ST applicant and 28 years for physically handicapped applicant) on 1st July of the corresponding year. The Vice-Chancellor, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla/ Sardar Patel University, Mandi shall have the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum period of 6 months.
- Applicant can seek admission to the first year of the course(s) only if he has English as one of the compulsory subjects in the 10+2 examination.
- Students having compartment in 10+2 will not be considered for admission in BA/B.Com 1st year.

5. OUTLINES OF UGC CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

1. Core Course (12 papers for regular courses): The Papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/University adheres to common minimum standard. Also the course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/ subject/ domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (4 papers for regular courses)

Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each university has complete freedom to suggest its own papers under this category based on their experience, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

2.2 Dissertation/Project*: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course (2 each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses) : An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline(s) of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore discipline of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category is suggestive in nature and each university has complete freedom to suggest its own papers under this category based on its expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/ subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and *vice versa* and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines. "SEC" courses are value-based and skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): (2 papers for regular courses)

i) Environmental Science

ii) English Communication/ Hindi Communication/MIL/Communication.

3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (4 papers for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/ hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category is suggestive in nature and each university has complete freedom to suggest its own papers under this category based on its expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

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4. Practical/tutorials (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper): The list of practicals provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practicals from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Addition will however be of similar nature.

5.1 Annual System

An academic year comprising of 180 working days. With six working days in a week this would mean that each academic year will be having $180/6=30$ teaching/working weeks. Considering that each teaching day has 5 teaching/working hours, a teaching week would have $5 \times 6=30$ working/teaching hours and each academic year will have $30 \times 30=900$ teaching hours available for each student.

A candidate has to opt for eight (8) subjects, to be studied throughout the year. In order to be promoted to next year of the course, it is compulsory to pass in minimum six (06) subjects with 35% marks in term end/Internal assessment, with 40% in aggregate, is the basic condition to be declared passed in the subject.

5.2 Credits

The term 'credit' refers to the weight age given to a course, usually in terms of the Number of instructional hours per week assigned to it. This explains why they are

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usually called credit hours. The credits also determine the volume contents and delivery of programme such as lectures, tutorials, practical, assignments etc.

For the purpose of credit determination, instruction is divided into three components:-

(a) Lectures (L):

Classroom lectures of one hour duration.

(b) Tutorials (T):

Special, elaborate instructions on specific topics (from Lectures) of one hour duration.

(c) Practical (P) :

Laboratory or field exercises in which the student has to perform experiments or other practical work of two hour duration.

Each one of these components is considered as equal to one credit. One lecture (L) as well as one Tutorial (T) of one hour a week is considered as one credit, whereas one Practical (P) of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total weightage given to a course in terms of credits will be equal to $L+T+P$, where L is the number of one hour Tutorials per week, and P is the number of two hour Practicals per week. This can be written in symbols as: $C=L+T+P$. Where, C is the credit weight age for a particular course.

The total minimum credits required for an under graduate degree programme is one hundred thirty two.

Fees and funds are charges as under:

1. Fee shall be deposited at the time of admission.
2. Fines and other dues, if any shall be realized in the month of March.
3. College fees and other charges are to be paid on the dates according to the schedule notified by the college office, otherwise fine shall be charged from the students. If a student fails to pay his/her fee till the end of the month on which fees or fine are charged, his/her name will be struck off from the college rolls.
4. The library security will lapse if it is not claimed within one year after leaving the college.

8. RAGGING NOT ALLOWED

Ragging in and out of the college campus or roads/approaches leading therein is strictly prohibited. Ragging is a cognizable offence. If any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged under rule 22, 17(a) to (d) of Himachal Pradesh University Ordinance to expel the guilty student from the College.

Ragging includes any type of physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual or group, either by words or in conduct, which creates an apprehension in the mind of a person that he/she cannot pursue his/her studies free from any mental disturbance or torture created thereby. Any person who aids or abets such an action shall be guilty of ragging. Any student convicted of an offence under this ordinance shall be expelled from the institution and will not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of 3 years from the date of order of such expulsion.

All students who have been admitted to the college shall be deemed to have given the following undertaking:

I have gone through the rules and regulations regarding discipline of the University/college/institution, and I hereby solemnly affirm that I will not indulge in

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any act of ragging/indiscipline and that if I am found guilty of such offences as are covered under these rules, I will be liable for punishment vide UGC letter No.F-8-1 1/97 (C.P.P.-II) dated 7-7-2001 for implementation of the Supreme Court guidelines regarding curbing the menace of ragging in educational institutions.

9. RULES FOR STUDENTS

It is compulsory to fulfill the required lecture attendance, and students shall be allowed to appear in the end term examinations only if they have passed in Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and house test conditions laid by the University. In case a student fails to fulfill any of these conditions, he/she will not be allowed to sit in the examination as per resolution No. 22 of the Academic Council of the Himachal Pradesh University.

It is essential for all students to take the class tests given by the subject teacher from time to time in addition to House Examinations to be held by the College and notified at the proper time.

Internal Assessment:

The internal Assessment will be of 30 marks.

Mid Term = 15 marks

Assignments/Seminars/Tutorials = 10 marks

Attendance = 5 marks

Condition: *Only those students shall be allowed to appear in End Term Examinations, who passed in CCA as per HPU Note 1 of Ordinance 7.10(D) dated 14.03.2018.*

A . Conduct and Discipline

The Principal can impose fine, suspension or expulsion on any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as listed below. **Violation of discipline in the campus will not be tolerated at all.**

1. Apart from ragging, other serious offences are listed below:

- (a) Anybody found guilty of writing obscenities/dirty words on blackboard, wall or furniture.
- (b) Aimlessly loitering in the verandahs, raising noise or attempts to disturb classes.
- (c) Smoking or taking of drugs/alcohol etc. in the campus of the college.
- (d) Any attempt to damage the furniture or any property in the campus.
- (e) Bringing unwanted outside elements/persons to the campus or sitting unnecessarily within the campus.

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- (f) Playing in the ground without the permission of the Principal.
- (g) Pasting posters on the walls or on the Notice Board without Principal's permission.
- 2. Students who participate in sports or other extracurricular activities/educational tours must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.

Every student must always carry with him/her the identity card which is issued to him/her as he/she joins the college. He/she must produce Identity Card whenever demanded.

Parents/guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college.

B. Rules for Leave

Students are allowed ten leaves in an academic year.

- 1. A student can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, he/she should apply on the **Proforma**, co-signed by parents/guardians and duly recommended by the tutor(s).
- 2. A tutor can recommend/approve leave(s) upto 6 days, for longer duration, a student must get his/her leave application signed by the Principal.
- 3. Leave during House Examination/Class Test will be sanctioned by the Principal in special cases only.
- 4. If a student absents himself continuously for more than 7 days without authorized leave, his/her name will be struck off the rolls of the college. Such student will have to seek re-admission by making an application giving the reason to the Principal with recommendation of the tutor and on payment of the prescribed fee.
- 5. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

A student can only be re-admitted twice. He shall cease to be a student after that. Re-admission is required to be sought within ten days of the date on which the notice of struck-off is put on the Notice Board, failing which it is to be assumed that the student is not interested in continuing as such.

C. General Rules

- 1. Even if a student earns a prize on the basis of University Examination, this prize will not be awarded if he/she does not appear in the House Examination. However, this condition will be relaxed in case of a student who represents the college in inter-college/University/State/National Competition provided the concerned student has sought prior permission of the Principal.

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2. Whereas prize for merit position will be awarded only if the student secures minimum of 55% marks in aggregate and pass in all subjects.

10. MIGRATION

10.1 Migration from another college and *vice versa* is governed by the Himachal Pradesh University/Sardar Patel University rules.

10.2 The migrating student must bring with him/her:

- a) Lecture attendance statement.
- b) Statement of marks obtained in the house test.
- c) Character certificate from the Principal of the college last attended.

10.3 Provisional admission to the college in such cases is not permissible.

10.4 After the migration has been sanctioned and notified by the university, the student must join the second college before the final date given by the university.

10.5 The first college is entitled to the tuition fee for the month in which the University sanctions the migration.

10.6 No Migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the University.

10.7 The admission of a student migrating from another university, or migration during the same course from an affiliated University shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of the Himachal Pradesh University/Sardar Patel University in this behalf from time to time.

10.8 The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/she produces the migration certificate and the certificate of good conduct from the head of the institution last attended. A student disqualified by any other university shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification.

11. LIBRARY RULES

11.1 Students will be allowed to issue four books at a time, provided they have their ID cum library card. Loss of the ID card must be reported immediately to the library.

11.2 Failure to return the book(s) on the 14th day from the date of issue will entail a fine of Re. 1 per book per day, which shall then increase to Rs. 2 per book per day after the first week.

11.3 Students must check the condition of the books before getting them issued, and if found damaged the same should be reported to the librarian.

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11.4 If a book, after it is issued to a student, gets damaged or is lost the borrower (student) will be required to pay for the damages or loss. Loss of books should be immediately reported to the librarian in writing.

11.5 Books from Reference Section are issued for consultation in the library against ID card between 10 AM and 4 PM. Students may also get one book issued from Reference Section for overnight study.

11.6 Students are required to take clearance from the library before the final examination.

11.7 Library is a sacred place. It expects decency and decorum to be maintained not only by its staff but by the visitors and readers also. Therefore, the College expects its students to observe necessary silence while they are in the library.

12. FEE CONCESSION AND SCHOLARSHIPS

12.1 Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC category are entitled to various scholarships.

12.2 Students belonging to IRDP families, and minority community and meritorious students are also entitled to scholarships.

12.3 As per Govt. Notification No. EDN-H (8) 7/76 dated 29-06-2001, all girl students of H.P. will receive full tuition fee concession upon submission of Bonafide Himachali Certificate.

12.4 A specially enabled student will also receive full fee concession and also entitle to scholarship.

12.5 However, a student can avail only one scholarship in a year.

12.6 One of the multiple siblings studying in the college will be eligible for half fee concession. This concession will be available to the sibling studying in the lower class.

13. STUDENTS' FACILITIES/ACTIVITIES

13.1 College Student Central Association

A student's Central Association is formed in the College according to the rules and regulations of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla/ Sardar Patel University, Mandi. Besides maintaining discipline in the College, the CSCA plays an important role in involving students in various co-curricular activities like seminars and functions at Intra/inter-college level.

13.2 College Magazine

College magazine "मणिमहेश" is published once a year. It is a medium for expression and cultivation of creative writing among the students. The publication of the magazine will depend upon the availability of resources.

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13.3 Educational Tour

Depending upon the availability of funds, the College also provides the facility of educational tour under the supervision and guidance of teachers. The students will visit such places which are of educational, historical, cultural or industrial importance. Only those students will be eligible to these tours who fulfill 75% of the class attendance and who get minimum marks of 35% in the house examinations.

13.4 Parent-Teacher Association

The College has formed a Parent-Teacher Association. This association has been working and has contributed towards the improvement of the college infrastructure and provided assistance as per the requirements of the college in the welfare of the students.

13.5 Career Counseling, Guidance & Placement Cell

With the objective of providing timely information to the students regarding various career opportunities, a career counseling, guidance & placement cell exists in the College. A team of dedicated teachers collects the information from various sources and disseminates the same via the Notice Board and through personal contacts. Interested students are advised to read the displayed information regularly.

13.6 Co-curricular Activities

Besides preparing students for competitions outside the college, like Youth Festival, Inter-College competitions, etc. they are also encouraged and guided towards participation in the celebration of important occasions like Independence Day, Republic Day, Science & Technology Day, Himachal Day, Hindi Day, Teachers' Day, etc.

13.7 N.S.S.

The College initiated a half unit of NSS w.e.f 10/10/2006 under HPU advisory committee vide item number 4 in its meeting held on 13/09/2006. The NSS unit of the College can enroll 50 students as volunteers.

13.8 Tutorial Groups

In order to encourage interaction between students and teachers, tutorial groups are created so that the students can discuss their problems (academic or otherwise) with their tutors.

13.9 Grievances Redressal Cell

A Students Central Association Advisory Committee and a Student Affairs Committee comprising of various teachers have been constituted in the college. The students can approach these committees with their grievances and get them resolved.

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13.10 Clubs/Societies

The college has following clubs/societies:

13.11 Old Student's Association

The College is on the verge of constituting Old Students' Association.
